Indoor eating With the start of the rainy season, we've consulted with the health department to establish safe eating conditions indoors:

- Distancing classes are spread out over two tables, spots to sit are marked
- Classes are separated from each other
- Lower capacity (only one grade at a time eats in the cafeteria)
- Increased ventilation (4 industrial fans) and air filtration (3 air filtration devices)
- Hand sanitation before and after eating

When the grounds are too wet to eat in the forest, we're also using the courtyard for lunchtimes. We keep classes separate, maintain as much distance as possible and sanitize hands before and after eating.

Halloween Costume Guidelines

We encourage students to report to school in their Halloween costumes on Thursday 10/28 if your family celebrates Halloween. Students must still wear their "COVID" masks throughout the day and costumes need to be practical and comfortable so students can sit and complete classroom activities during the day. We will not allow costume masks, fake weapons, fake guns, or fake blood. Families are responsible for putting on students'

makeup before coming on campus. We also ask families to respect the cultural diversity of our students at Washington and not dress in costumes that represent other cultures. Washington Halloween Parades will be held on Thursday, 10/28. This date is also an early release day due to report card conferences (tk/kinder will be released at 12:30 pm and 1st - 5th at 1:15 pm the entire week of Oct 25 - 28 - no school on 10/29). Due to COVID restrictions that don't allow parents to come on campus, the city of Berkeley will be closing off McKinley Avenue between Bancroft and Channing so that we may conduct Halloween parades safely. Please plan to park and walk if you come to campus at this time.

Students will walk with their teacher south down McKinley on the east sidewalk and cross the street to walk back up the sidewalk on the west side of McKinley. Families are encouraged to distance themselves in the center of McKinley and enjoy the parade. Due to the tight schedule, students will return to class right after the parade. Due to COVID restrictions, we will not have food, drink or parties at the parade.

We're just happy that we can have a parade at all! If you are able to attend, can you volunteer to take photos for parents who aren't able to come? Please contact your room parent or your child's teacher.


Scenario 1: Has Symptoms, Revised 8.13.21



If you've had contact with someone with COVID-19


Applies to City of Berkeley Child Care, School & Youth Programs (9.17.21)



10-Day At-Home (Standard) Quarantine

Who's eligible?

- Children & adults
- Must be UNVACCINATED & ASYMPTOMATIC




REQUIREMENTS:

Students who develop COVID-19 symptoms or test positive during quarantine must isolate immediately

7-Day⁺ At-Home (Shortened) Quarantine

Who's eligible?

- Children & adults
- Must be UNVACCINATED & ASYMPTOMATIC



REQUIREMENTS:


- ~ Test negative on or after Day 5 required to release from quarantine as early as Day 8
- Students/staff who do not meet the testing timeline must switch to 10-day (Standard) Quarantine
 Students/staff who learn of an exposure belatedly should calculate quarantine from their exposure date and meet test requirements from that point forward
- Students/staff who develop COVID-19 symptoms or test positive during quarantine must isolate immediately

*If test results are not received by the quarantine release date (Day 8), the student/staff should remain in quarantine until the negative test result is received or Day 11, whichever comes first,

7-Day⁺ In-School (Modified) Quarantine

Who's eligible?

- ~ Students for exposures in supervised TK-12 school settings
- ~ Must be UNVACCINATED & ASYMPTOMATIC
- Close contact & positive case both masked during exposure



REQUIREMENTS:

- Test as soon as possible after learning about the exposure.
- Test negative on or after Day 5 required to release from quarantine as early as Day 8.
 Students who do not meet the testing timeline must stop attending in-person class & switch to 10-day (Standard) Quarantine
- ~ Students who learn of an exposure belatedly should calculate quarantine from their exposure date and meet test requirements from that point forward
- ~ Students who develop COVID-19 symptoms or test positive during quarantine must isolate immediately

*Students in Modified Quarantine may attend before- & after-school programs located on their own school campuses. No sports. No high-risk activities (e.g., wind instruments, choir). No participation in any other extracurricular or community activities. Stay home & away from others.

If test results are not received by the guarantine release date (Day 8), the student should remain in guarantine until the negative test result is received or
