Want to know the big picture with the **school budget**? Join SSC and ELAC on Oct 17 6 pm at Longfellow 1500 Derby St, Berkeley, CA 94703 for the Budget Big Picture presentation by Superintendent Stephens and Natasha Beery. This is something committee members have been asking about for a couple of years, and it's exciting to be able to address some big questions. This budget presentation will talk about state and local factors that impact BUSD budget cuts, the upcoming BUSD tax ballot measures, and resulting impacts on groups like SSCs, PTAs, the PAC, etc. For this reason in particular, the invitation to attend this meeting is open to anyone from the Washington community who may be

Should you let your child be on Social Media such as Tik Tok, Instagram, Snapchat?

Social media can be very attractive to our children, and it falls to all of us to keep kids safe and age appropriate online. At school, we do a series of Digital Citizenship lessons to give students a good grounding in appropriate school computer use, but we also need your support and cooperation to monitor student online activity at home, especially if your child has a smartphone.

It's also important to remember that children can be held responsible at school for inappropriate social media activity that occurs at home and after hours if it impacts the school environment by targeting other students with bullying or threats. Please also be aware that sites such as TikTok require all users to be a minimum of 16 years old. For Snapchat, Instagram and Facebook, 13 years old is the minimum age. Younger children can be exposed to very mature content on these sites and it is the parents' responsibility to make sure their children are not being exposed to inappropriate media content outside of school.
