Research shows that it's better to **praise your child for working hard, not for being "smart"**. Carol Dweck conducted an experiment (Meuller & Dweck,1998) in which kids were given a task to do. At the end of the task, half of the children were praised for being "smart", the others were praised for working hard. For the next task, the kids were given a choice between something that was easy or difficult. 90% of those praised for being smart chose the easy task, while the majority of those praised for working hard chose the more challenging one. When children are told they are smart, they of course feel good, but later when they struggle with something, as everyone eventually does, they may think, "Hmmm, I'm not so smart." Try to praise what the child has done, ex: "It's wonderful that you have learned how to add numbers", instead of "Wow, you can add numbers, you are so smart."
