Pick up of student items and return of library and classroom books

Please plan to come to the courtyard on McKinley Ave. to pick up your child's belongings, return books and instruments and receive a summer learning packet.

- Thursday 6/4, 9:30 am to 4:30 pm grades: kindergarten, 1st and 2nd. Adults only may
 come to McKinley Ave orange gate to pick up belongings and return library and classroom
 books.
- Friday, 6/5 9:30 am to 4:30 pm grades 3, 4 and 5. Adults only may come to McKinley
 Ave orange gate to pick up belongings and return library and classroom books and school instruments.
- Parent/guardians can come on either of those dates if they can't make the assigned date.
- Students who have checked out chromebooks may keep them over the summer if they are

returning to a BUSD school.

The last week of school (June 8-12) will consist of professional development classes and planning for teachers. There will be no Office Hours or direct instruction required of teachers the final week of school, and no final report cards will be issued. All students will be advanced to the next grade in the fall. Please contact your child's teacher with any questions or concerns about their progress.

What will the 2020-21 school year look like?

From all indications, Distance Learning will form the core of instruction next year, with a hybrid model eventually possible: a mix of in-person and distance learning all year with increased hours of direct instruction from teachers. There will be the option to choose 100% distance learning. We are working on options to provide safe social interaction for children.
