

Class assignments for next year:

Teachers meet at the end of each year to make up teacher blind, balanced class groupings for next year. They work hard to ensure that each child is placed with at least one friend. If you feel that your child should be separated from a particular student, please inform your child's teacher. Due to the unique circumstances of distance learning, we will be keeping class groupings largely intact for next year.

Teachers do not determine who next year's teacher will be, and we do not take requests to have a particular teacher, as we expect all teachers to have the skills, determination and training to meet each student's unique learning needs.

When teachers change grade levels, (for example Ms. Geminder is moving to 5th grade next year) we make every effort to assign students who have not had that particular teacher before. You will learn your child's class assignment a few days before the start of classes in August.
