The Ed Hub will be closed Nov. 23-27 for the Thanksgiving Holiday. Students and families can come to the Ed Hub for:

- Technology needs (Chromebooks, computer exchanges, power cables, earbuds, internet tools, or tech support)\*
- "Leveled" K-12 Books for reading enjoyment
- Spanish-speaking support for any of the above

BOOK DRIVE Berkeley Schools Volunteers (BSV) is organizing a book drive at the Ed Hub. BSV is accepting high-quality books for elementary students in new or very gently used condition at the Ed Hub.Book donations (please in paper bags only) will be received during regular Ed Hub hours. After a week-long quarantine, books will be sorted, leveled, and bagged by BUSD literacy coaches & librarians. Books will be distributed at the Ed Hub to any family in need of books at home.

VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED: Sign up to Work a Shift at the Ed Hub The Ed Hub is a partnership between the BUSD and the Berkeley Public Schools Fund – the single, centralized distribution site for BUSD families to pick-up needed supplies: from school supplies to Chromebook exchanges and books. We need at least 2 volunteers (including 1 Spanish speaker) per shift to run the Ed Hub smoothly! The Ed Hub will likely be up and running through the school year.

Enrolling in Middle School: Parents of all students who are entering middle school must provide all documents listed on the enrollment checklist and complete a preference form ranking their preferences of schools. Under state law, parents may request any school in the district; however, first priority will be given to families who live in the school's attendance zone. Out-of-zone students will be considered after in-zone students are assigned. Key dates are Round One: January 6 – February 7, 2020
