STAR tests, round 2: All California school districts are required by the state to have an objective test to measure student learning during remote instruction. BUSD has chosen to use STAR computer adaptive tests as a three times a year, quick (less than 30 minutes on average) assessment that can be used as an additional data point when measuring student learning. Computer adaptive tests are designed to offer easier questions if a student gives a wrong answer and harder questions if a student gives a correct answer, until the student's learning level can be determined. All students are expected to take the STAR, as they would be expected to take a spelling or math test given as part of classroom instruction. This is a low stakes assessment, meaning that there are no consequences for high or low scores. Teachers continue to learn how to administer the test and best interpret the results. Parent/guardians should be able to access student results through the Illuminate parent portal.

You can help your child feel ready for STAR by watching this short video which

explains, among other things, that computer adaptive tests like the STAR keep asking you harder questions if you're getting them right, so it can see where kids "top out". So everyone will get some questions wrong, and that's ok! In fact, if you're getting really hard questions, you're probably doing just great! Just choose what you think is the best answer and keep going.
