Update on reading and math intervention: As at other BUSD elementary schools, all of Washington's reading and math intervention teachers have been reassigned to be full time Distance Learning teachers for the rest of the year. This means if your child was receiving extra reading or math support outside of the classroom, these services won't be provided for the rest of the year. We're currently trying to recruit staff to conduct 6 week intervention small groups after school.

Students with IEPs (Individualized Education Plans, a service of Special Education) will continue to receive services as per their IEP.

It is currently the expectation that intervention will resume in the fall.

Q: My child stayed home from school because they are sick. Do I have to test my child for COVID-19 before they can go back to school?

A: Thank you for keeping your child home when they have symptoms of illness.

Children should be kept at home if they have fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle/body aches, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting and diarrhea. If your child is at school and develops symptoms of illness, you will be contacted to pick them up from school.

Testing is recommended if you want your child to return once they are feeling better, before the 10 day waiting period. You can get free testing from your child's doctor or from the City of Berkeley link COVID-19: Get tested You can also present a note from your child's doctor clearing them to return to school.

If you choose not to test or visit the doctor, your child can come back to school from an illness-related absence when:

- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms started
- The child has no fever for at least 24 hours without the help of medicine and the child's symptoms have improved.

STUDENT COVID TESTING AT SCHOOL ON TUESDAY APRIL 27

For your student to be eligible to be tested for COVID on Tuesday 4/27, the following steps are required. There is no cost for the testing. Please read all **FOUR** steps carefully.

All of the forms can be filled out and submitted online. No printing or wet signatures are required.

STEP 1: ONE TIME Registration with PMH laboratories- Please click link below to register:

Fill out all areas of form that have an st. Washington's Client # is 1542

For the two answers below that, please enter "PCR" which is the mouth swab test.

STEP 2: ONLY NEEDED IF UNINSURED

The District is committed to making testing available to all students. When registering with PMH in the previous step you will be asked for your insurance information. If you do not currently have health insurance, please fill out the form at the link below so the cost can be covered. This form will be required on a monthly basis.

All families who wish to have their students participate need to fill out the form below. The form says you are consenting to have your child tested through June of 2021 and covers all testing dates until school is out. Please click the link below.
