STUDENT COVID TESTING AT SCHOOL ON TUESDAY May 11

For your student to be eligible to be tested for COVID on Tuesday 5/11, the following steps are required. There is no cost for the testing. Please read all **FOUR** steps carefully.

All of the forms can be filled out and submitted online. No printing or wet signatures are required.

STEP 1: ONE TIME Registration with PMH laboratories- Please click link below to register:

For the two answers below that, please enter "PCR" which is the mouth swab test.

STEP 2: ONLY NEEDED IF UNINSURED

The District is committed to making testing available to all students. When registering with PMH in the previous step you will be asked for your insurance

information. If you do not currently have health insurance, please fill out the form at the link below so the cost can be covered. This form will be required on a monthly basis.

Girls Leadership has conducted groundbreaking new research on personal, societal, and structural factors that deeply impact Black and Latinx girls' leadership identity, aspiration, and skill development. See the whole report here, and read for a summary below.

With girls of color making up over 50% of the U.S. girl population, it is imperative that research focusing on the experiences of girls and girl-serving organizations shift its lens to one that is intersectional and centers the needs of girls of color. Our research study seeks to fill this gap in the research by examining factors that drive both leadership cultivation and opportunities for Black and Latinx girls. Our panelists shared their personal stories of the daunting

task of parenting Black and Latinx girls in a White world. They talked about their pain in witnessing the way their daughters' leadership has been minimized and

diminished by the education system, and they vulnerably expressed that there

have been times when they have also bought into the myth that their daughters

are "less capable" than their White peers.

We couldn't take notes fast enough. See the whole report here

positions that the PTA funds (Coach Don, Restorative Justice, Counseling) that

are paid out via BUSD, and they require a lump sum for all of those positions

BEFORE the school year begins.
