The Read-a-Thon is our final fundraiser for Washington this school year. Money raised will go to support teachers and the PTA general fund, which will help pay for school-wide needs like physical education with Coach Don, enrichment classes (like poetry and movement), Restorative Justice, and counseling services. This is the preliminary budget for next year, and is subject to change. The official budget will be voted on again at Back To School night in the fall.

The PTA needs to approve a preliminary budget every spring because there are positions that the PTA funds (Coach Don, Restorative Justice, Counseling) that are paid out via BUSD, and they require a lump sum for all of those positions BEFORE the school year begins.

# Do you want lower-cost internet? Or discounts on computers? Read on to learn about a brand new program for qualifying families!

#### **Discounted home internet!**

The Federal Communications Commission has launched a temporary program to help families and households struggling to afford Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers.

Eligible households can enroll through a <u>participating broadband provider</u> or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an <u>online</u> or mail-in application.
