What do I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms* with no known exposure? (applies to VACCINATED and UNVACCINATED children)



*Common symptoms of COVID-19:

- · Fever or chills
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatique
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- · New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Comfort

- Reassure vour child
- **Explain** as appropriate for your child's stage of development

Get Tested

- Contact your child's health care provider
- Get your child tested right away

If child

tests negative

OR does not

get tested

If child tests positive

Notify your child's school about the test results right away

Isolate

- · Your child must follow Isolation **Instructions** for at least 10 days
- Keep your child at home and away from others

Return to School after **Isolation**

If your child had COVID-19, they can go back to school when:

- (1) they have completed **Isolation**; AND
- (2) they have had no fever for at least 24 hours (without medicine); AND
- (3) they feel better.

Return to School After Negative or No Test

As long as your child **does NOT test positive**, they can return to school when: (1) they have no fever for at least 24 hours (without medicine) AND (2) they feel better (symptoms are improving) PLUS at least 1 of the following:

- your child tests negative for COVID-19; OR
- vou provide documentation from a health care provider that your child's symptoms are from another diagnosis: OR
- it's been at least 10 days since their symptoms began.

Check school/program policy before sending your child back.

Scenario 1: Has Symptoms, Revised 8.13.21

COVID testing is scheduled to happen at Washington every Wednesday morning 8:30am to 12pm

One-Time Student Testing Registration here. We want 100% of Washington students to test every week! This year, our new testing partnership with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and Vestra Labs will only require a one-time student testing registration and parent/guardian consent. Please complete the Primary Health registration form so your student can be tested every week school is in session. You do not need to upload insurance information or any identification documents. This consent covers both rapid antigen testing and PCR testing.

Please make sure all information is completed in your registration in order to receive your student's test results.

After registration you will need to confirm your email address and phone number. You will receive an email and text to do this.

BUSD will provide weekly rapid testing at all elementary, middle, and high school sites. The district will also deploy testing units to schools where students are under a modified quarantine due to a close contact with a COVID-19 case. Students under modified quarantine who are asymptomatic may continue to attend school as long as they test twice weekly through the BUSD testing program during the quarantine period.

The test is a shallow nasal rapid antigen test. Results can be expected in 15 to 20 minutes.

Testing for elementary students will happen just outside their classroom during school hours.

Tests will be administered by trained Vestra technicians. Students will be guided through the process of inserting the nasal swab just inside of each nostril for 15 seconds. The technician will then process the test.

Students will return to their class immediately after testing.

If Your Student Tests Positive during COVID testing at School

If a student tests positive with a rapid test, the technician will administer a second PCR test to confirm the student is positive. We expect to get these test results in 48 to 72 hours. BUSD will presume the student is positive unless the PCR test comes back negative. We will isolate the student while the parent is contacted to pick them up. Staff will be prepared to reassure the student, should the student become upset. School COVID Liaisons will begin contact

tracing with the student's parent/guardian and the BUSD nurse will provide isolation instructions.

The City of Berkeley Health Department has given the okay to turn on the water fountains on Washington's playground. Hand sanitizer is available after use. We continue to urge students to bring a refillable water bottle labelled with their name for use during school.

Campus opens at 8 am Please do not drop your child off prior to this time unless they are enrolled in the <u>BEARS</u> before school program. Thank you!

Washington can stay open during most instances when smoke from wildfires is in the East Bay. All classrooms and offices have HEPA 17 air purifiers that work effectively to lower the spread of COVID-19 with windows opened or closed. Please refer to this <u>Air Quality Index (AQI) guidance</u> to learn about how schools will respond to rising AQI levels.



At AQI levels over 150, we will eat indoors in the cafeteria, which already has markings for distancing in place.

Decisions about school closures for very high AQI level events are made by the Superintendent of Berkeley Schools.
