We need playground volunteers! It's really challenging to staff noon supervision positions, so if you have any


extra time available to volunteer Monday - Friday 11 am to 12:40 pm, we need you! Sign up here.

Go to the BUSD Parent Portal. Enter your user name and password.

The middle school enrollment policy has not been reviewed since 1994. The Board recently extended the review timeline into 2022 to allow for more opportunities for community engagement. There will be a possible Board decision about a policy change in November 2022, with a possible implementation date of August 2023.

Parent/Guardians can now volunteer at Washington! There are 2 options:

- I. **BSV Classroom Volunteers:** Parents and community members who want to support *learning* in classrooms *regularly*/w*eekly.*
 - · Commitment: An hour a week (or more, if desired) for the school year
 - Process: Thoughtful matching by BSV to a Host Teacher
 - Site Limitations: May serve in one classroom at one site only
 - Requirements: Upload proof of COVID vax & complete BSV orientation. Community members must also be fingerprinted (not parents, if working in own child's class)
 - Official Clearance: BSV sends match introduction email to Volunteer & Host Teacher. Volunteer's name automatically added

to "BSV Screened Volunteers by Site" spreadsheet

- Identification on Campus: '21-22 BSV Name Badge, sent via mail to Volunteer. Volunteers still sign in/out in the Main Office every time (for contact tracing)
- BSV Contact: Jissel Poblete: jisselpoblete@berkeley.net
- Sign Up Here: New Classroom Volunteer Application

II. BSV School Support Volunteers: Parents and/or community members who want to support various school-related tasks on a *one-time or sporadic basis*.

- · Commitment: one-time or a series of visits
- Example Roles: Playground Supervision (@ site), 1x Classroom Project (@ site), BSV Task Runner, BSV Ed Hub, BSV Supplies Assembly, etc.
- **Site Limitations:** Role limited to one school (and one classroom) only. Often, though not exclusively, outdoors.
- Requirements: Upload proof of COVID vax
- Official Clearance: BSV confirms clearance via email to Volunteer and School Contact (listed in application),
 if applicable. Volunteer's name automatically added to "BSV Screened Volunteers by Site" spreadsheet to
 Principals & BUSD Leadership.
- Identification on Campus: Volunteers sign in/out in the courtyard and email
 washingtonattendance@berkeley. every time (for contact tracing) & get BSV Volunteer sticker to wear
- BSV Contact: Valerie Kratzer: valeriekratzer@berkeley.net

- SIGN UP HERE: BSV School Support Volunteers Application (shorter)
- After that, Sign Up for Washington's Playground Supervision

Please allow 1 full week between new volunteer application & final clearance.

Actualización de voluntarios de Berkeley Schools Volunteers (BSV)

Voluntarios de BSV en el Salon de Clase/ BSV Classroom Volunteers: Padres y miembros de la comunidad que desean apoyar el aprendizaje en el aula de manera regular / semanal

- Compromiso: Una hora a la semana (o más, si se desea) durante el año escolar
- Proceso: Emparejamiento cuidadoso por BSV con un maestro anfitrión
- Limitaciones del sitio: Puede servir en un salón de clases en un solo sitio
- Requisitos: Cargar prueba de COVID vax y orientación completa de BSV. Los miembros de la comunidad también deben tomar las huellas digitales (no los padres, si trabajan en la clase de su hijo)
- Autorización oficial: BSV envía un correo electrónico de presentación de coincidencia al maestro voluntario y anfitrión. El nombre del voluntario se agrega automáticamente a la hoja de cálculo "Voluntarios seleccionados por BSV por sitio". Los voluntarios siguen registrando su entrada / salida en la oficina principal cada vez (para rastreo de contactos)

- INSCRIBASE AQUI: Solicitud de voluntariado en el nuevo salón de clases

Voluntarios de Apoyo Escolar de BSV/ BSV School Support Volunteers: Padres y / o miembros de la comunidad que desean apoyar varias tareas relacionadas con la escuela de forma única o esporádica.

- Compromiso: visitas únicas o una serie de roles
- Ejemplos de funciones: Supervisión del patio de recreo de Washington (@ sitio), 1x Proyecto de aula (@ sitio), Programa de tareas de BSV, Centro de educación de BSV, Ensamblaje de suministros de BSV, etc.
- Limitaciones del sitio: Función limitada a una escuela (y un aula) solamente. A menudo, aunque no exclusivamente, al aire libre.
- Requisitos: Cargar prueba de autorización oficial de COVID vax: BSV confirma la autorización por correo electrónico al
 contacto de voluntarios y la escuela (enumerados en la solicitud), si corresponde. El nombre del voluntario se agrega
 automáticamente a la hoja de cálculo de "Voluntarios seleccionados por BSV por sitio" para los directores y el liderazgo de
 BUSD.
- Identificación en el campus: Los voluntarios se registran en el patio principal cada vez (para rastrear contactos) y obtienen una calcomanía de voluntario de BSV para usar
- Contacto de BSV: Valerie Kratzer: valeriekratzer@berkeley.net
- REGISTRESE AQUI: Solicitud de voluntarios de apoyo escolar de BSV (más corta)
- Después de eso, REGISTRESE AQUI Washington's Playground Supervision

Washington School Drop off and Pick up Procedure

School begins at 8:10am and ends at 1:30pm for kindergarten and 2:25pm for all other grades. Families and caregivers must wait outside the gate for their child to enter or exit the campus. Due to COVID restrictions, families and caregivers are not currently allowed to enter campus without advance permission from the principal.

If your child comes to school after 8:45 am

If your child arrives after 8:45, call the office (510) 644-6310 and tell the reason why the child is late (overslept, traffic, appointment, etc). The child should go directly to the office to get a late pass.

If you need to pick your child up early:

Let the office know by email (washingtonattendance@) or call (510) 644-6310 ahead of time if you can.

When you arrive at the orange gate on McKinley, call the office at (510) 644-6310 or tell our Safety Officer Mr. Alves why you are there. Your child will be sent to the orange gate to meet you. Remember, due to COVID restrictions, families and caregivers are not currently allowed to enter campus without advance permission from the principal.

What do I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms* with no known exposure? (applies to VACCINATED and UNVACCINATED children)

If child

tests

positive



*Common symptoms of COVID-19:

- · Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- · Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Comfort

- Reassure your child
- Explain as appropriate for your child's stage of development

Get Tested

- Contact your child's health care provider
- Get your child tested right away

If child

tests negative

OR does not

Isolate

- Your child must follow Isolation Instructions for at least 10 days
- Keep your child at home and away from others
- Notify your child's school about the test results right away

Return to School after Isolation

If your child had COVID-19, they can go back to school when:

- (1) they have completed **Isolation**; **AND**
- (2) they have had no fever for at least 24 hours (without medicine); **AND**
- (3) they feel better.

Where can my child get tested?

Testing can be done by your child's health care provider or at a FREE COVID-19 test site. Find one here:


As long as your child **does NOT test positive**, they can return to school when: (1) they have no fever for at least 24 hours (without medicine) **AND** (2) they feel better (symptoms are improving) **PLUS at least 1 of the following:**

- your child tests negative for COVID-19; OR
- you provide documentation from a health care provider that your child's symptoms are from another diagnosis: <u>OR</u>
- · it's been at least 10 days since their symptoms began.

▲ Check school/program policy before sending your child back.
